## Elmbridge Buses

To use this information:

Step 1: Identify which buses serve your area by reviewing the Bus Route Maps and plan your route

Step 2: Review the timetables for relevant bus number - some buses are more frequent at peak times than off-peak

Step 3: Plan how to pay

If travelling between Cobham, Oxshott and Weybridge, check the affordable Chatterbus timetable.

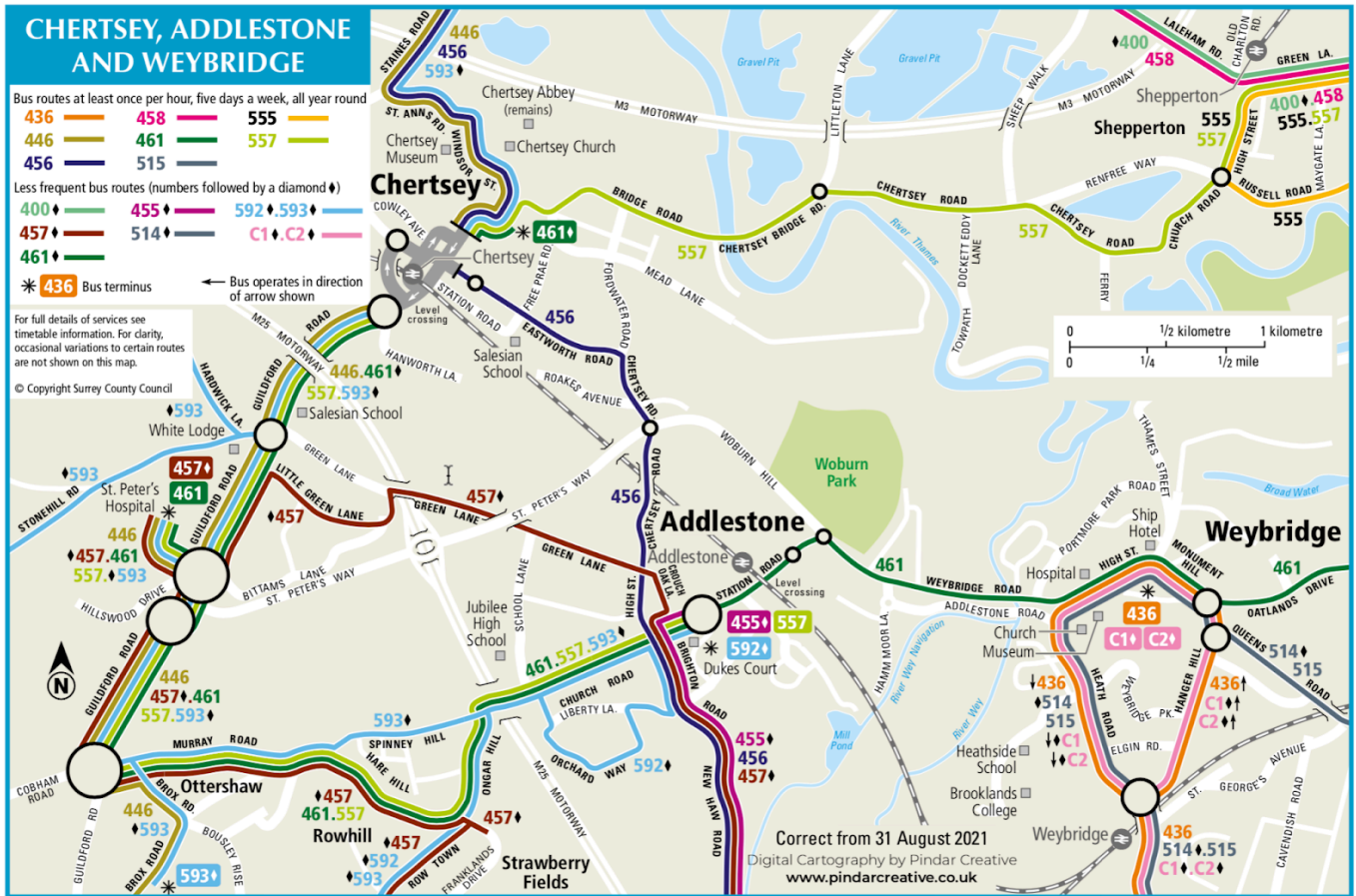

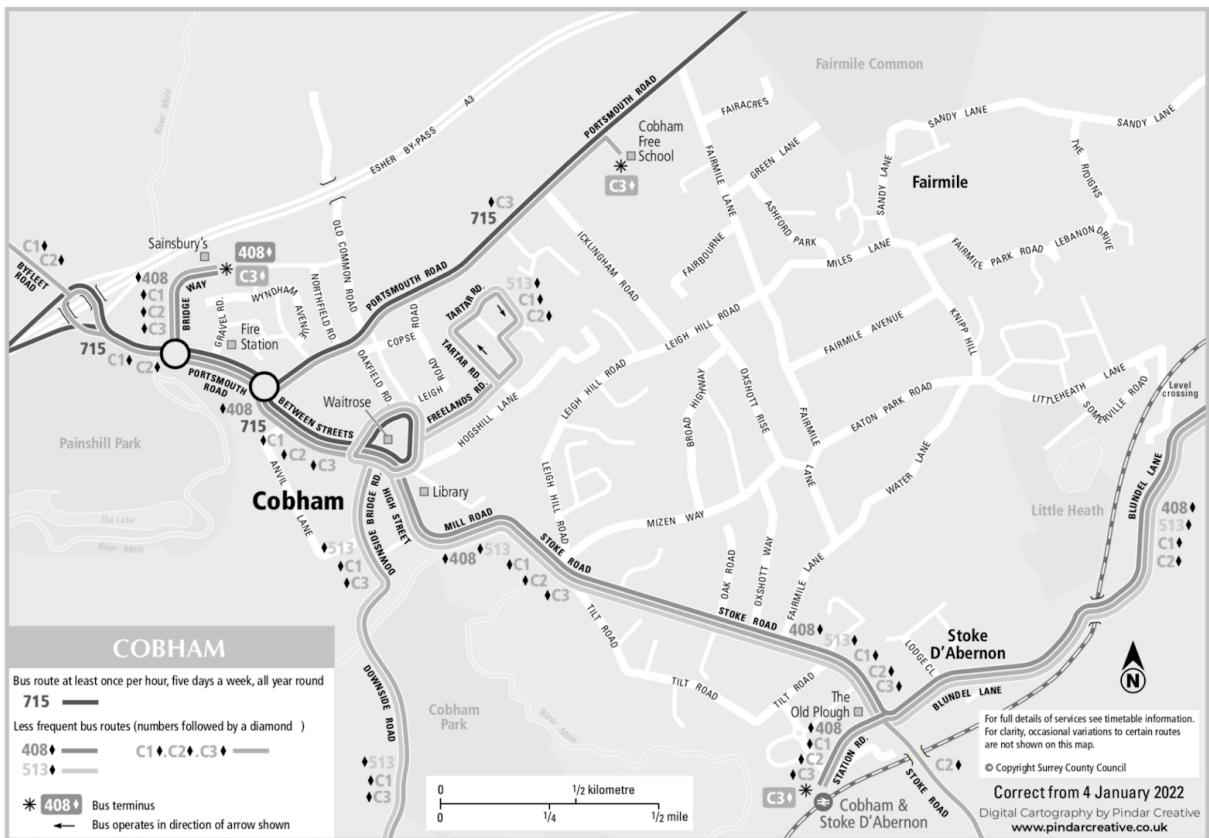

Chatterbus is a community, not-for-profit, affordable bus operating between Cobham and Weybridge.

It connects Cobham and Stoke d'Abernon train station, certain destinations and schools in Cobham and Downside, Brooklands, Weybridge and Oxshott.

On Saturdays only, Leatherhead is also a destination.

### **Step 3: Plan how to pay**

#### ***i) Check if you are eligible for a bus pass***

Did you arrive via Homes For Ukraine scheme? The Surrey Homes for Ukraine bus pass scheme has been extended. Please use the link [here](#) to check your eligibility by bus company and to apply.

Chatterbus – free travel to those in [financial need](#):

- National age and disability related passes; Disabled Pass holders free at all times and Disabled Pass holders with a C+ Pass may also take a companion free at any time.

#### **Acorn - multi-operator bus ticket for North Surrey**

Unlimited daily or weekly bus travel; see link above for list of bus routes covered and current fares. You can change between different bus companies many times with no further charges, so useful for long journeys or when using different bus operators.

The service covers most of Elmbridge, Runnymede, Spelthorne, parts of Woking and some services to Kingston and Heathrow Airport.

Buy your Acorn ticket for the day or week from the driver on the first bus you board.

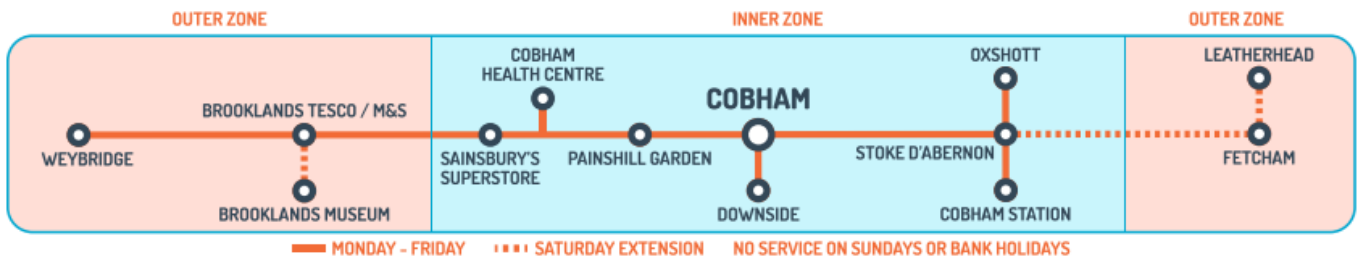
Tickets can be purchased and used at any time and on any day of the week. Most buses on routes covered by the ticket display the Acorn logo.

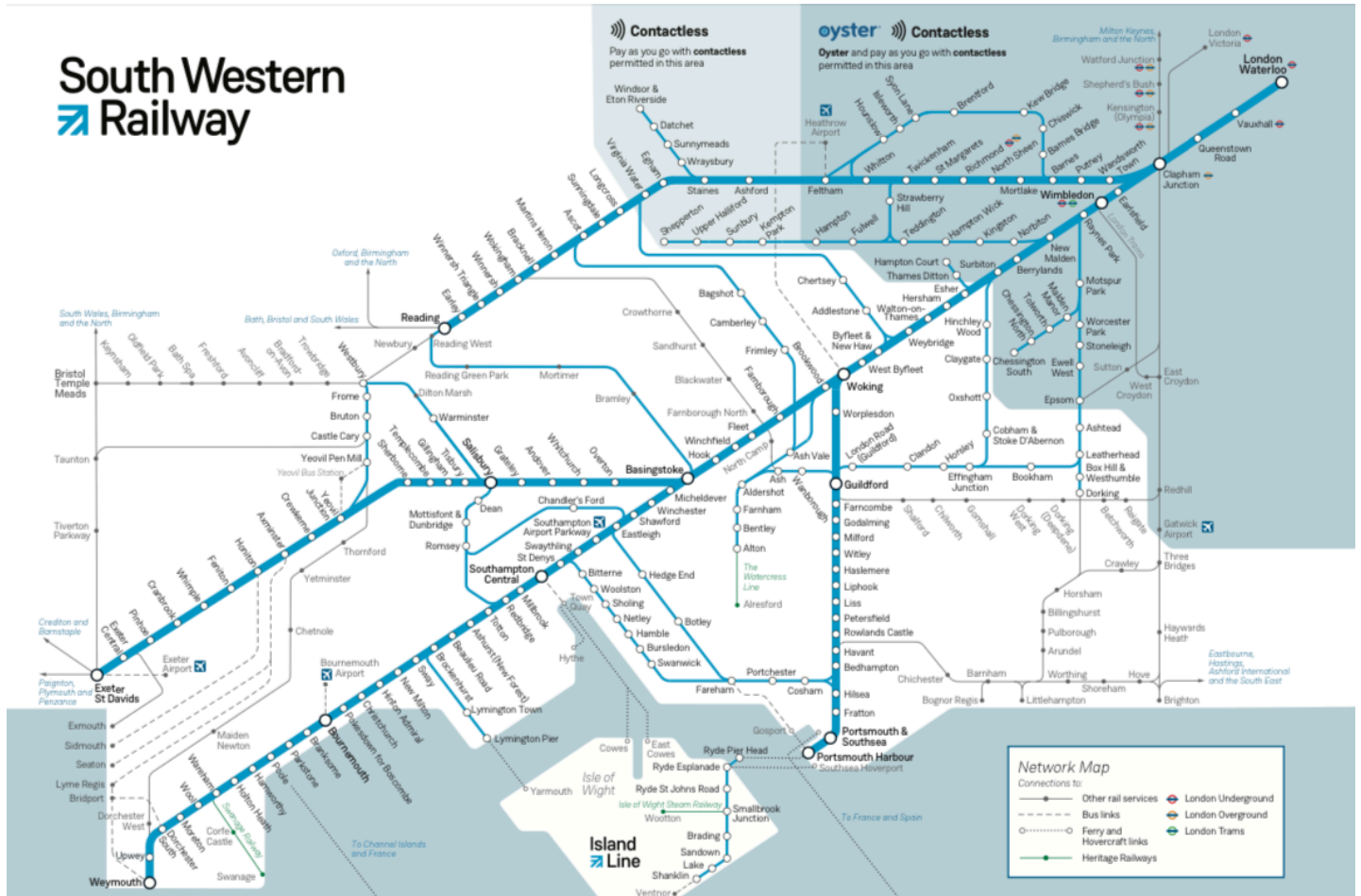

Trains connect our part of Surrey well with London, Surbiton, Woking (particularly from Weybridge, Walton and Esher) and Guildford.

They are also easy to navigate when start and destination stations are on a single line:

**Train tickets**

There is a wide range of ways to buy train tickets – see information [here](#). Train travel can be expensive. Buying ahead, using a season ticket, travelling off-peak, checking for discounts and using railcards can help.

The Network Railcard is the default card for adults. There are other railcards for teenagers, young adults, people with disabilities and older people. If using a railcard, make sure you check it is valid for the train time you choose before buying your ticket.
